



The growing recognition that human, animal, and environmental health are intimately connected (One Health) has led to a global understanding that an interdisciplinary, multisectoral approach is crucial if we are to address global concerns including agricultural sustainability, food security, emerging zoonoses, natural and anthropogenic disasters, biodiversity loss, and antimicrobial resistance. With its diverse schools and scholars in one geographic area, The University of Pennsylvania is uniquely positioned to train leaders in One Health. We have been funded this year by Penn's Environmental Innovations Initiative to engage a broad community of students and scholars committed to interdisciplinary problem-solving – the **One Health@Penn Research Community**. We have focused the first series of One Health@Penn initiatives on challenges raised by our rapidly changing climate and describe below the efforts that we have launched this year.




